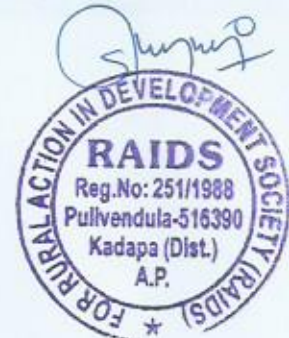

### **1. Girls Advocacy Alliance Services -GAA**

District Level Household Survey (DLHS) 4 (2012-13) study report confirms that In YSR Kadapa District, Andhra Pradesh State 31.2% women in the age group of 20-24 years confirms that they had got married before they completed 18<sup>th</sup> year of their age. It is also one of the district in which trafficking is rampant. The YSR Kadapa district also ranks three in girl child school dropout rate after Kurnool, Prakasam districts. Based on these criteria YSR Kadapa district was selected for implementation of Girls Advocacy Alliance Project which aims to prevent Gender Based Violence against women and girls through promoting secondary education and JOVT.

**Girls Advocacy Alliance** is a global, collective initiative of Terre des Hommes – Netherlands, Plan International and ECPAT to offer equal opportunities

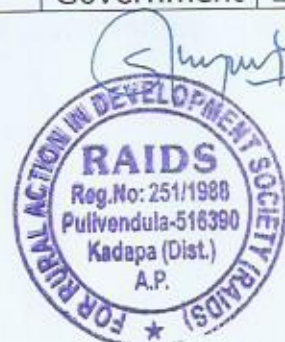


to the girl children across ten countries in Asia and Africa, including India. The core focus of the program is to prevent Child Trafficking and Child Marriages with the cross cutting issues of promoting secondary education and providing Job Oriented Vocational Trainings. The program is being implemented in both A.P and Telangana states. **HELP** is implementing GAA program in the state of Andhra Pradesh with special focus on Prakasam, **Kadapa (RAIDS)** and Anantapur Districts (HANDS) of Andhra Pradesh in alliance with MAHITHA (supported by PLAN India), with the support of **Terre des Hommes – Netherlands**. The Girls Advocacy Alliance determines to work with four actors out of which Government is one of the major actors.

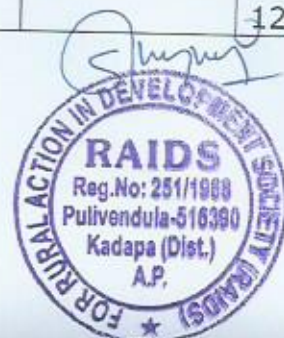

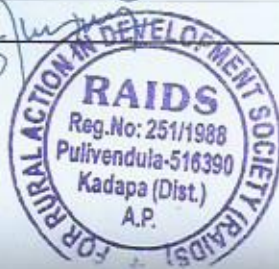

## బాలికల పురోగతితోనే సమాజాభివృద్ధి : జడ్పీ

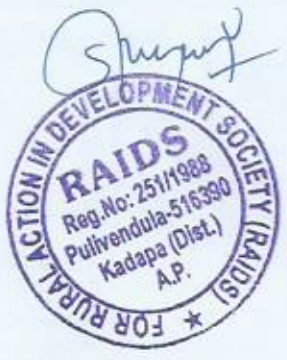

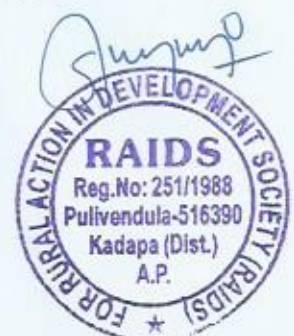
All CHILDLINE activities take place within the framework of the Four C's. they from the firm foundation on which we stand, they permeate through our work as well as define our long term vision.

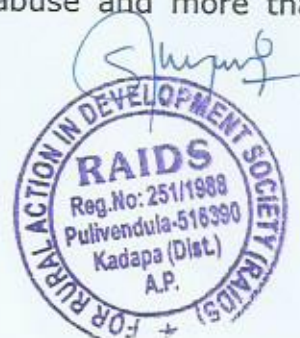

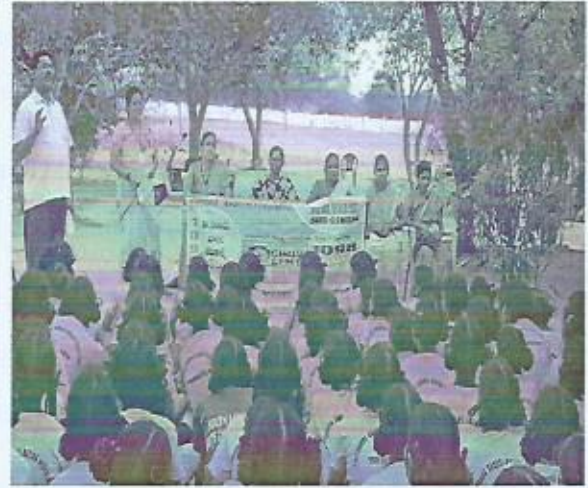

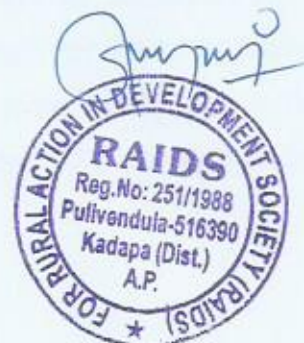

**3. Description on TDH-NL Revolving Fund Program for the period From Apr' 2018 to Mar' 2019**

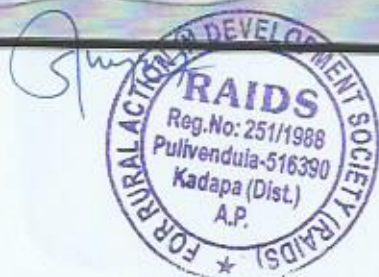
Terre des hommes – Netherlands Revolving Fund is supported to Women and Children through Rural Action In Development Society (RAIDS), in order to improve the social and economic status in 69 villages since from February' 2008. This fund is supported to women to have their own Income Generation Activities and thereby getting Additional Income in various trades from Rs. 6, 000/- to Rs.10, 000/- per month.

**In this Period 107 Self Help Groups with 460 Beneficiaries availed loan Rs. 57, 95, 000/- towards Income Generation Activities like Dhobi Material, Electrical, Baldari / Centering Material, Cultivation, Computer Center, Goat rearing , Sheep and Goat Rearing, Seeds Purchase, Fertilizers, Land Development, Petty Shop, Fancy Items, Bamboo Basket Making, Medical Lab, Saree Business New and old, Rangoli Powder Selling, Agriculture Cultivation and Implements, She Buffalo, Carpentry**



Work, Old saree business, Charcoal making and 2<sup>nd</sup> hand auto Activities etc.

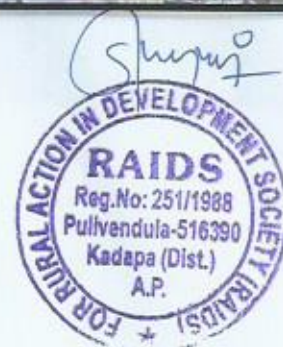

#### 4. Micro Credit Fund Programme for Vulnerable Women:

With aim to Stop Women exploitation and economic empowerment of vulnerable families in YSR Kadapa District, started micro credit program to support women from Dalit, Yanadi and Budabudakala Community in Pulivendula&ThondurMandal through RAIDS, one of the pioneering NGO in the district supporting the vulnerable families indifferent sectors. Initially in Budabudakala, Yanadi and Dalit Community an amount of INR 26, 12, 780/- is given to RAIDS to support PREMA MACTS as a loan for a long term to use as revolving fund to enable RAIDS to provide loans to women community through their Self HelpGroups who are the members of the group. PREMA MACTS are lending the group 6 to 12% for annum which relatively leaser than market rate.

Thanks to micro credit and other supportive programs. An amount of approximately INR 26, 12, 780/- has been disbursed as a loan so foe the members for various purposes including livelihoods promotion that are ultimately addressing all forms of exploitation.





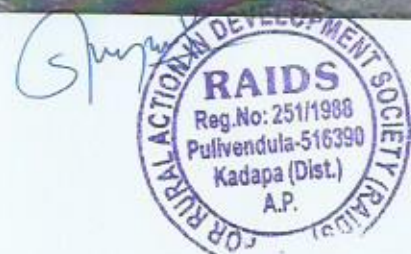

**5. Fashion Designing Course to Young Girls and Young Women for 30 Members MEDP – NABARD Supported Project**

Rural Girls and Women are constrained by lack vocational skills and income generation sources. This makes them dependent on their counterparts and become victims of exploitation and abuse.





Fashion Designing course is designed to cover 30 Girls as a remedy to the problem. RAIDS in collaboration with NABARD one vocational Skill Development Programme on FASHION DESIGNING AND TAILORING covering 30 adolescent girls and women.

Is Organized this promising activity is designed to cover 30 active young girls and Women from economically poor section from Pulivendula urban. A preliminary screening test is conducted to assess the interest levels of the participants and identified 30 girls and women in teenage.

A 60days training course is designed to elicit inherent skills of the participants. With theory and practical's class's course is designed and started.



30 girls were made in 2 batches and were thought both theory and practical's with a duration of 3 hours. Each day session starts by 9 AM and end by 1pm. The participants were provided with fashion designing materials, equipment and tools required to complete the training





successfully. One trained experienced instructor guides and trained them throughout the training with the support of charts and various upcoming designs.

As a follow up RAIDS have prepared the data of the trainees and is negotiating with apparel industries for employment.
