2.	Work Experience On SHG formation	With the support of terre des hommes- Netherlands, MRDF, MVM and Childline India Foundation. RAIDS started its work in the year 1988 in 68 villages with an objective of empowering the women through organizing them into Self Help Groups. By adopting the process of educating the women on their Socio-Economic issues and importance of farming into Self Help Groups. Organizing exposure visits to effective SHGs sharing the experiences and success stories achieved by the group members to motivate the non group members to farm into SHGS, orientation through trainings on group and financial
		management, setting democratic practices and norms, introducing financial management systems (Book keeping, internal and external audit), conducting periodical assessment and finally federating the SHGs to work towards their social issues collectively formed Prema MACTS with 3562 members.
